REMINDER FROM THE FIRE CHIEF

SMOKE ALARMS

With today's modern furnishings, fires can spread much more rapidly than in the past when more natural materials were used. Because of this, having a sufficient number of properly located smoke alarms is essential to maximize the amount of available escape time.

Smoke alarms save lives!! Having a working smoke alarm cuts the chances in half of dying in a fire. Almost two-thirds of home fire deaths resulted from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.



Here's what you need to know!

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each sleeping area and on every level of your home.
- Test your smoke alarms monthly
- Replace all smoke alarms in your home every 10 years.

CARBON MONOXIDE

Although the popularity of carbon monoxide (CO) alarms has been growing in recent years, it cannot be assumed that everyone is familiar with the hazards of carbon monoxide poisoning in the home.


Often called the invisible killer, carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless gas created when fuels (such as gasoline, wood, coal, natural gas, propane, oil, and methane) burn incompletely.

In the home, heating and cooking equipment that burn fuel are potential sources of carbon monoxide. Vehicles or generators running in an attached garage can also produce dangerous levels of carbon monoxide.

Here's what you need to know!

- The dangers of CO exposure depend on a number of variables, including the victim's health and activity level. Infants, pregnant women, and people with physical conditions that limit their body's ability to use oxygen (i.e. emphysema, asthma, heart disease) can be more severely affected by lower concentrations of CO than healthy adults would be.
- A person can be poisoned by a small amount of CO over a longer period of time or by a large amount of CO over a shorter amount of time.
- CO alarms should be installed in a central location outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Street and Trail Preservations

Several streets and pathways in the City will receive asphalt preservation surface treatments later this year. Affected residents and trail users will be notified in advance so as to be minimally inconvenienced by closures and detours (usually lasting no more than 24 hours).

• **Reconstruction of 500 North:**

400 West to Franklin Parkway – This section of 500 North will be reconstructed in order to handle the planned additional traffic loading when the expansion of the nearby FedEx distribution hub is complete. Work will begin soon and will affect the road for a minimum number of days.

• **Overlay of Springwood / Springridge Neighborhood –**

In order to prevent structural deterioration and more expensive repairs in the future, several streets in the Springwood Drive neighborhood will have their asphalt ground away and replaced this year. The extents of the project depend on funding availability, but the streets planned to receive an overlay treatment are: Springwood Drive, Springwood Circle, Lillywood Lane, Springridge Drive, and Springridge Circle. •

FOXBORO RESIDENTS

Last September, city crews installed a new secondary water booster pump station on 900 North adjacent to the Hampton Place apartments. This has increased the water pressure by about 20 psi for all sprinkler systems in the Foxboro area.

With this increased water pressure, there will be better coverage throughout yards and those isolated “brown spots” will disappear. Please evaluate your sprinkler system when the secondary water is turned on this spring. Chances are, you can reduce your watering time and still have a great looking yard. Let’s all pitch in and conserve one of our most valuable resources.
