CONSTRUCTION AND CITY PROJECTS

- **Center Street Reconstruction** Construction is well underway on Center Street between Redwood Road and Foxboro Drive, and is scheduled to last until the end of August. The work includes widening Center St. to accommodate a center turn lane for vehicles as well as bicycle lanes in each direction. The asphalt path from the Jordan River trail will also be extended along the south side of the road. Construction will be done in several phases, so please watch for altered traffic patterns and business entrances. Access to Cutler Dr. from Center St. will also be limited throughout the project duration. Please use alternate routes to avoid this area if possible.
- **Highway 89 Storm Drain** - Work is almost complete on a new storm drain line along the east side of Highway 89, between Center St. and Odell Ln. The highway will now be widened south of Odell Ln. to include a deceleration and turning

lane for northbound traffic. Please watch for temporary lane closures and construction activities through July.

- **350 North Street Waterline and Reconstruction** - Work continues installing a new, larger water line between Main Street and Highway 89 to better serve the City's culinary water needs. When that is completed, the roadway will be reconstructed and resurfaced. Work is expected to last through early August, requiring various traffic restrictions. Please watch for construction equipment and personnel on Main Street and along 350 North.
- **City Street Markings** - Painting crews will soon begin refreshing street markings throughout the City. The work will occur almost exclusively at night, so please be on the lookout for signs of men working after dark.

FIRE RESTRICTIONS

Recent wildfires are good reminders that fire conditions along the foothills are more hazardous this year than in a drier year because of additional undergrowth. The City has an ordinance restricting the discharge of fireworks, open burning, and the use of any ignition source, east of Orchard Drive from the Bountiful City boundary to the SLC boundary, and in all areas adjacent to the south curb of Eagleridge Drive.
