RAP TAX REAUTHORIZATION

This November, your ballot will have a section asking residents to Reauthorize the City's RAP Tax.

WHAT IS THE RAP TAX?

In 2009, in order to fund the construction of several parks, the voters in the City approved the imposition of the tax of 1/10 of a cent sales tax collected wherever sales taxes are paid in the City of North Salt Lake. Because the City Council felt there was an imminent need for park space, the Council issued bonds to fund the parks rather than wait 10 to 20 or more years to save sufficient funds for new park construction. The bond proceeds were used to construct the Legacy Park, Tunnel Springs Park and the Wild Rose Trailhead Park. The terms of the bonds were for 25 years, even though the RAP tax was only authorized by State Statute for 8 years. At the time the bond was authorized, the City Council felt that it was likely that the RAP tax would be extended by its citizens. The City is obligated to continue to make bond payments that average \$310,000 annually until the year 2029. If the RAP tax is not extended, the City will need to either raise revenue from other sources such as property tax, or reduce other expenditures such as for police service, park maintenance or road repairs.

The Recreation, Arts and Parks (RAP) tax is a 1/10 of a cent sales tax authorized by the state of Utah. Under the form adopted by the City, it is tax revenue authorized for the purpose of funding recreation, arts, parks and open space facilities. Under current state statute, the tax on the ballot will authorize the imposition of the tax for an additional 10 years, whereupon it can be reauthorized by the citizens again if they so choose. It is currently expected that the vast majority of the funds raised will

be used to make bond payments. If excess funds are collected, they will be used for other recreation, arts or parks projects in the City's master plan.

The public is currently paying this tax at all North Salt Lake cash registers. Because the initial eight-year period authorizing the collection of the tax expires in 2018, the re-authorization of the RAP tax will appear on the regular ballot in November. If it is approved by voters, then the collection of the tax will continue as it is now. If approved, payers of the tax in North Salt Lake will not see an increase in the cost of transactions at the cash register since the tax is being collected already.

Salt Lake City, Bountiful, West Bountiful, Woods Cross, and Centerville and many other cities have all imposed and are collecting RAP or similar taxes on their respective transactions. Therefore, North Salt Lake residents will continue to pay RAP taxes to other cities when shopping outside of North Salt Lake at stores such as at Costco, Home Depot, Smiths Marketplace, Target and numerous other locations, regardless of the outcome of this election. Our city gets no benefit from the RAP taxes paid to other cities. However, if our RAP tax is reapproved, we will continue to get the benefit both from our residents and outside residents when they shop in our city.

The City Council adopted a resolution stating that the proceeds of the RAP tax would be used for bond payments AND to fund projects adopted in the General Plan if revenues exceed bond payments. It is projected that the annual RAP tax revenues will be approximately \$348,000 and so there may be additional revenue to support some new projects in the future.



CONSTRUCTION

• **Eagleridge Drive Resurfacing** - Work is anticipated to begin on September 25 to address the failing asphalt on lower Eagleridge Drive. Between Parkview Drive and Edgewood Drive, the existing asphalt will be removed and replaced completely. The roadway will be open to traffic throughout the project, with some temporary lane restrictions. Residents living within the resurfacing limits will also have restricted access to their driveways when paving activities take place, but will be notified in advance. Drivers and pedestrians are asked to please watch for workers and equipment in the project area, and to obey all traffic control devices. The project is expected to be complete before the end of October.
