

A SEVEN MEMBER BOARD OF TRUSTEES GOVERNS THE DISTRICT. EACH CITY WITHIN THE DISTRICT APPOINTS ONE BOARD MEMBER FOR A FOUR-YEAR TERM. THE TWO REMAINING BOARD MEMBERS ARE ELECTED FROM THE DISTRICT AT LARGE. THESE BOARD MEMBERS ARE ELECTED IN THE MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS HELD IN ODD-NUMBERED EYARS. ELECTED TERMS ARE ALSO FOR FOUR YEARS.

RAP TAX INFORMATION - PROPOSITION #12

WHAT IS THE RAP TAX?

The Recreation, Arts and Parks (RAP) tax is a 1/10 of 1¢ sales tax collected wherever sales taxes are paid in North Salt Lake. This is 1¢ for every \$10. It is authorized to fund recreation, arts, parks and open space facilities. The City uses this tax revenue to make payments on a bond previously issued for park construction.



DOES NSL COLLECT RAP TAX?

Yes. In 2009, residents approved the tax for construction of Legacy Park in Foxboro, Tunnel Springs Park and Wild Rose Trailhead Park.

IS THE TAX PERMANENT?

No. If the tax is reauthorized by voters, State statute will only allow it for ten (10) years at which time the need would be reevaluated.

ARGUMENTS FOR EXTENDING THE RAP TAX

City is required to make bond payments

The City is obligated to make bond payments until 2029.
Reauthorization will generate revenues to meet this obligation.

We're all paying this tax in other cities

Salt Lake City, Bountiful, West Bountiful, Woods Cross, Centerville and many other cities have imposed and are collecting this tax. Regardless of the outcome of this election, NSL residents will still pay the RAP tax when shopping at Costco, Home Depot, Smiths Marketplace, Target and many other retail locations.

Prevents decreased service or increased property tax

Reauthorization of this tax will prevent the City from having to raise revenues through a property tax increase, or decrease services such as police or roads. The RAP tax is the best way to pay the bond obligation.

Able to maintain recreational assets

Residents of the City authorized the imposition of this tax and the City constructed several parks on the strength of this revenue stream. Residents who are now enjoying the early construction of these parks should pay a nominal charge in sales tax to pay for the costs of the parks.

RAP Tax is only 1¢ on a \$10.00 purchase

The tax is very small compared to other ways of paying the bond. This is a very minimal amount per year and a great funding source for park development.



ARGUMENTS AGAINST EXTENDING THE RAP TAX

The City solicited arguments against the proposed RAP tax reauthorization and did not receive any responses.


CONSTRUCTION

• **Eagleridge Drive Resurfacing**
 Work is underway to address the failing asphalt on lower Eagleridge Drive. Between Parkview Drive and Edgewood Drive, the existing asphalt will be removed and replaced completely. The roadway will be open to traffic throughout the project, with some temporary lane restrictions. Residents living within the resurfacing limits will also have restricted access to their driveways when paving activities take place, but will be notified in advance. Drivers and pedestrians are asked to please watch out for workers and equipment in the project area, and to obey all traffic control devices. The project is expected to be complete by the end of October.
