WINTER CONCERNS

While this has been a drier than normal winter, we have had some heavy snowfall recently. During these storms, our Public Works crews work hard to keep our streets clear and open as quickly as possible. We still encounter occasional problems that prevent us from having a safe and efficient cleanup. Here are some things you can do to help:

1. Become familiar with the Snow Removal Guide. This 2-page guide has tips and instructions on how to assist in the snow removal process. This and the snow plow priority map can be found on the City's website at www.nslcity.org.

2. Don't park or allow visitors to park on City streets at night or during a snow storm. This is very unsafe and prevents the City from clearing snow properly. On-street parking overnight

in the winter is against the law and you could be subject to a citation.

3. Never shovel or push snow back out onto City streets. This is dangerous, creates a nuisance for other drivers, and is also against the law.

4. Know how to shovel the area around your driveway to minimize the plow's impact in front of your home. Instructions are found in the [Snow Removal Guide](#).

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Eaglepointe Estates Auxiliary Storm Drain - Work will begin near the end of March to install a new drainage pipe for storm water runoff generated by the Eaglepointe Estates neighborhood. Most of the pipe will be installed on undeveloped City property but will impact roadway traffic where it joins the existing storm drain system at the intersections of Eagleridge Drive with Valley View Drive, and Eagleridge Drive with Cynthia Way. Both of these intersections will be closed for one weekend in coming months to allow the connections to be completed. Advance notification of planned closures will be posted on the roadway at least a week beforehand. Please watch for these notifications as well as construction personnel along Eagleridge Drive.

I-215 Interchange Reconstruction and Redwood Road Expansion - The Utah Department of Transportation is continuing its work along Redwood Road south of Center Street throughout the spring. The final product will be a completely redesigned interchange with I-215, a widened Redwood Road, and an improved intersection with Center Street. Traffic lanes and restrictions will change from week to week as the project progresses, so please be aware of temporary signs and other traffic control devices while travelling through the work zone.
