

UTILITY RATES

The City has a need to increase fees and charges periodically to provide the same level of service. We prefer to raise rates in smaller increments more often than waiting several years and enacting large fee increases. This year the City will raise culinary water and garbage rates about 2%. For the average residential customer, this will add \$.50 to the base charge and a minimal increase for usage.



The garbage rate is increasing \$.22 per can for regular garbage, and recycling rates are increasing \$1.35 per can. Recycling rates have increased drastically due to changes in global recycling markets. China is no longer accepting most recycling, and this has driven up costs worldwide.

These new rates begin July 1st.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

- **Eaglepointe Estates Auxiliary Storm Drain** – Work has begun to install a new drainage pipe to handle storm water runoff generated by the Eaglepointe Estates neighborhood. The pipe will be mostly installed on undeveloped City property but will impact roadway traffic where it joins the existing storm drain system at the intersections of Eagleridge Drive with Valley View Drive, and Eagleridge Drive with Cynthia Way.

In the coming weeks, Eagleridge Drive will be closed at Cynthia Way during daytime hours for one weekend (Saturday and Sunday). The road will be open to traffic during the night. Drivers will be required to follow posted detour around temporary closure. Please be on the lookout for traffic notifications as well as construction personnel and restricted traffic patterns along Eagleridge Drive.

- **I-215 Interchange Reconstruction and Redwood Road Expansion** – The Utah Department of Transportation is continuing its work along Redwood Road south of Center Street throughout the summer. The final product will be a completely redesigned interchange with I-215, a widened Redwood Road, and an improved intersection with Center Street. Traffic lanes and restrictions will change from week to week as the project progresses, so please be aware of temporary signs and other traffic control devices while traveling through the work zone. - **Street and Trail Preservations** – Throughout the rest of June, several streets and pathways in the City will receive asphalt preservation surface treatments. Affected residents and trail users

will be notified in advance so as to be minimally inconvenienced by closures and detours (usually lasting no more than 24 hours). Maps can be found at www.nslcity.org.

- **130 East Street Reconstruction** – This road will be under construction throughout June and July of this year. When completed, it will provide all new curb and gutter, sidewalk, decorative concrete park-strip, and asphalt roadway between Center Street and Orchard Drive.
