UPCOMING PROJECTS

There will be 3 major street reconstruction projects starting soon.

1) Orchard Drive North:
Beginning at Eaglewood Drive and going north to the City limit line (near the old Winegars grocery store). In addition to new asphalt, bike lanes will be installed.

2) Orchard Drive South:
From Center St. south to the Eaglebridge roundabout, this project will include new curb and sidewalk on the east side of the street and new asphalt.

3) Our third street project will be the south end of Eaglewood Loop from Rockwood Drive, west to Eaglebridge Drive.

The City is in the process of designing a new secondary water line to go along Rockwood Drive from Eaglewood Loop to South Tanglewood Loop. This project will tie into the



City's secondary pump building by Eaglewood Hole #8 and will provide secondary water to the area.

Finally, plans are being made to repair a 40-year old storm drain pipe in the canyon south of Lacey and Marialana Way, from Coventry to the detention basin above Valley View Dr. that has collapsed and separated in some places.

More information will be forthcoming on these projects. Thank you for your patience as we continue to provide essential city services.
