PREVENT CRIME IN NSL

Property crimes such as theft, car break-ins (vehicle burglary), and home break-ins continue to be the most common crimes reported to the North Salt Lake Police Department. The good news is that most of these crimes have trended lower in not only per capita crimes, but in actual numbers despite the growth of population in North Salt Lake over the last five years. The better news is that almost all of these crimes can continue to decrease with increased vigilance and awareness by our residents.

The police department has found a few common factors, which we may have heard before but are still true of the majority of these crimes. By working with our community members to eliminate these factors we hope we can continue to see a reduction in these crimes and continue to maintain and improve the high level of safety and security in our city.

First, keep your garage doors closed when you are not actively in the garage - day or night. Garage intrusions account for almost all of the home break -ins. By simply keeping your garage doors closed most of these burglaries could be eliminated. Also, remember to be cautious about who knows you are going to be away from home. Ensure your mail and garbage cans are checked and taken in, and in the winter have someone clear your driveway and walkways from snow. The police department will perform

vacation checks. Just call our office and let us know the details of when the home will be vacant and who may be coming and going, as well as a close contact number for us to call if we notice a problem.

Second, do not leave valuables in your car. A visible phone, wallet, i-pad, watch, etc. -anything of value to a thief is in easy access, even if your car is locked. A thief can enter a locked or unlocked car in a matter of seconds, steal the property and be gone. When possible, secure the vehicle in a closed garage, but if it is left outside, it is better to have the car in a driveway with night lighting and the car locked to deter thieves. And, never leave your keys or key fobs in your car.

Third, don't leave valuable equipment or other items outside unattended. Just like a car prowl, a thief can see these and steal them in a matter of seconds.
