NSL RESPONSE TO WIND STORM

On September 8, 2020 the Davis County region and parts of Salt Lake County were hard hit by a devastating wind storm. As the City mobilized to respond, we had many challenges including numerous competing priorities and, like all communities, a search for resources and assistance as the event unfolded. The City extends its heartfelt gratitude to its 22 member Public Works Department. These employees were key in the response to this disaster and they went to work! In spite of having obligations at their own homes right here in Davis County, these dedicated workers labored 14 hours a day from Tuesday to Sunday evening to dispose of green waste and clean up the City. Clean up will continue for a while longer, but this response is nothing short of incredible!! Our PW Department picked up green waste at over 500 locations and went through all City streets twice in the first week of our response. This work was accomplished while also accepting green waste at the Public Works shops.

A special thanks goes to our leadership in Public Works who are extremely organized and prepared for emergencies. 2020 has given them lots of practice, but they are very capable individuals and leaders who truly care about the City!

The City also thanks neighbors, family members, friends and patrons of local

church groups who immediately mobilized to help their neighbors. Last week, we asked for your assistance to get your own green waste to the landfill and we're grateful that so many did just that. We thank the City of Bountiful for making their landfill available and free to our residents for green waste drop-off.

The public may not know that because of the storm Davis County declared a state of emergency and activated their emergency operations center. These

actions allowed the Governor to activate the National Guard, UDOT and other employees to assist Davis County and its cities. Each day since the storm, Davis County emergency managers reached out to North Salt Lake to offer assistance and support. On Friday, Saturday and Sunday (11th-13th), the City was assisted by having 4-6 UDOT trucks, with drivers, work under the direction of our Public Works Department to help pick up green waste. This assistance

was invaluable in our response and we thank the State for their help. The State also sent several individuals with chainsaws to help us with tree problems at the many City locations that suffered damage.

Finally, we thank the Cities of South Jordan and Murray for quickly lending us needed equipment. We thank the public for its quick response also and are proud to live in a community where neighbors and friends immediately pitch in to help each other. The work will continue, but our streets are looking clean again. Please continue to look out for neighbors who need assistance, particularly as our Public Works Department closes its clean-up operation and gets back to its normal duties.



CENSUS 2020


Why is the Census important? The census provides critical data that lawmakers, business owners, teachers, and many others use to provide daily services, products, and support for you and your community.

Every year, billions of dollars in federal funding go to hospitals, fire departments, schools, roads and other resources based on census data.

The results of the census also determine the number of seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives, and they are used to draw congressional and state legislative districts.

What is the NSL Census response rate? Right now it is 75.6%, and we only have until September 30th to get the remaining 24.4%.



DO YOU HAVE AN ADU?



Accessory Dwelling Units, or ADUs include basement apartments, tiny homes, guest houses, etc.

The City has allowed for a grace period for residents to legalize their existing ADUs with no penalty. That grace period ends on November 11th, after which you may be cited for a code violation. To legalize your ADU, (free of charge) please submit a Land Use Permit to the Community Development Department for review.






DEER HOLLOW PUMP HOUSE BUILDING LANDSCAPING
