WINTER IS COMING

The Police and Public Works departments would like to remind residents and businesses about City ordinances that affect all of us in our efforts to keep NSL streets and sidewalks safe during periods of snowfall.

The main points of these Ordinances are found in the graphic below, and full details can be

found in the NSL City Code (Title 6, Ch. 2) at www.nslcity.org.

We appreciate our residents who make an effort to keep their families and neighbors safe by removing snow from sidewalks and driveways and who do not park on streets during snow storms or when plows are clearing the streets. (This can sometimes be a day or two after

the storm as crews work to clear the street from edge to edge.)

Large storm events affect all of us and we must work together, in a manner that is in everyone's interest to make this happen.

WINTER REMINDERS

REMINDERS FROM NSL POLICE & PUBLIC WORKS



- No parking during a snow event (ice, snow, hail, sleet or freezing rain)
- No parking until plowing is complete from pavement edge to pavement edge
- Vehicles may be impounded or subject to penalty if snow plows have to maneuver around a vehicle




- Property owners must remove all snow, ice and hail from sidewalk within twenty-four (24) hours of the end of the storm
- It is unlawful to blow, shovel or plow snow from private property onto a public street
- Any sidewalk where snow has not been removed may be abated by civil action



These things happen every year - usually because residents are unaware of city ordinances. These laws are in place to allow our snowplow drivers to clear streets as quickly as possible with their limited resources.

The police department has the responsibility to enforce these ordinances in order to ensure the safety of our residents using streets and sidewalks.

DO YOU HAVE AN ADU?



Accessory Dwelling Units, or ADUs include basement apartments, tiny homes, guest houses, etc.

The City has allowed for a grace period for residents to legalize their existing ADUs with no penalty. That grace period ends on November 11th, after which you may be cited for a code violation. To legalize your ADU, (free of charge) please submit a Land Use Permit to the Community Development Department for review.

Voting & COVID 19



Traditional polling locations will not be available for the November General Election.

All voters are encouraged to vote by mail.



What to Expect for the 2020 General Election

Voting By Mail:

Davis County is working with local Postmasters to ensure timely delivery of ballots.

Ballots will be mailed to all eligible voters 3 weeks before the election.

Return postage is provided.

Secure ballot drop boxes are located throughout the County. NSL City Hall has a new drive-thru location on the west side of the building.

Voting in Person:

In person voting will be provided primarily for voters with disabilities or voters who do not receive a ballot.

Early Voting:

Curbside Early Voting will be provided October 27-30 from 9am-5pm at the Davis County Clerk's office - 61 South Main Street, Farmington.

Election Day Voting:

A single drive-thru polling location will be at Legacy Events Center - 151 South 1100 West, Farmington and will be open on Election Day from 7am-8pm.





NEW COVID INFO



Current Health Guidance Levels



Questions about the Governor’s New Health Guidance Levels announced on 10/13/20? COVID transmission data throughout the state was analyzed and used to determine which counties are placed in one of three transmission levels. These levels correspond directly to case rates, positivity rates, and ICU utilization.

Davis County is in the “MODERATE” level of transmission. For the next two weeks, the following guidelines are in place:

• SOCIAL GATHERINGS:

Until 10/29: Social gatherings of 10 or fewer are permitted.

After 10/29: Social gatherings of 25 or fewer are permitted. The size may exceed 25 if each individual wears a face mask.

• MASKS:

Until 10/29: Masks are required by public health directive.

After 10/29: Masks are strongly recommended by public health; mask requirement is at the discretion of county executives in consultation with the local health officer.
