HOLIDAYS & COVID-19

ENJOY HOLIDAY ACTIVITIES AND TAKE STEPS TO PROTECT YOURSELF FROM GETTING OR SPREADING COVID-19.

CONSIDERATIONS FOR SMALL GATHERINGS OF FAMILY AND FRIENDS

Celebrating virtually or with members of your own household (who care consistently taking measures to reduce the spread of COVID-19) poses the lowest risk for spread. In-person gatherings that bring together family members or friends from different households, including college students returning home, pose varying levels of risk.

There are several factors that contribute to the risk of getting and spreading COVID-19 at small in-person gatherings. In combination, these factors below will create various amounts of risk.

CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING:


- **Community levels of COVID-19** – High, Moderate, Low?
- **Exposure during travel** – Think airports, gas stations, etc.
- **Location of the gathering** – Indoor? Outdoor?
- **Duration of the gathering** – Longer gatherings pose more risk.
- **Number and crowding of people** – More people pose more risk.
- **Behaviors of attendees prior to the gathering** – Have they been social distancing, mask wearing, handwashing, etc.?
- **Behaviors of attendees during the gathering** – Gatherings with more safety measures in place, such as mask wearing, social distancing, and handwashing, pose less risk than gatherings where these are not done.

DON'T GET PLOWED IN

When shoveling your driveway, pile snow downstream of snowplow operations. This will clear an area, or pocket, for the plow to drop the snow (see diagram).

Please DO NOT throw snow into the public street. It is against the law and creates additional hazards for drivers.

AVOID FROZEN PIPES

SEVEN WAYS TO PREVENT FROZEN PIPES

Keep thermostat above 55 degrees (day & night)

Seal doors and windows properly

Let faucets drip on the coldest days

Act swiftly if you suspect trouble

Keep garage doors closed

Warm up drafty areas with a 60-watt bulb

Open kitchen cabinets

WINTER PARKING REGULATIONS

BASED ON WEATHER, NOT DATE

Motorists may not park on public streets under the following weather conditions:

1. During a snowstorm where snow or ice are accumulating on the street; and,
2. After a snow event until the pavement has been plowed and cleared from edge to edge of the street. (This may be a day or two after the snowstorm, depending on the magnitude of the storm.) City Code 6-2-7(F)




