PROPERTY OWNERS ARE REQUIRED TO TRIM THE TREES ON THEIR PARKWAY

14' ABOVE THE STREET AND 8' ABOVE THE SIDEWALK*

Winter is knocking on the door! Just a reminder, it is the RESPONSIBILITY of the property owners to trim the trees on the parkway of their homes. The snow plows need to be able to clear the roadway without overhanging tree limbs damaging side mirrors, windshields and doors (saving taxpayer \$\$ for needed city services). According to City Code 7-9-6, trees, bushes or other growth must be at least fourteen feet (14') above the street and eight feet (8') above sidewalk. Thanks, everyone!
