## 2021 MUNICIPAL ELECTION




Elections matter, and LOCAL ELECTIONS MATTER THE MOST. The President of the United States, for example, although the most prolific figure in American politics, is the one least likely to affect your life on a day-to-day basis. The President does not dictate whether your dogs must be on a leash, how fast you can drive through your town, whether you can get a bartender's license, build a new deck, or whether the vacant lot down the street will be a park or a junk yard. Interestingly, people vote the most for the elections that affect them the least.

Election Day is Tuesday, November 2nd. Ballots can be dropped in any U.S. Mail box (postmarked by Nov. 1st) or can be dropped in any of the secure drop boxes throughout the county, including the convenient drive-through box on the west side of City Hall until 8:00 pm on November 2nd.



## 75th CITY CELEBRATION





### WINTER REMINDERS




WINTER Reminders

- No parking during a snow event
- No parking until plowing is complete from edge to edge
- Vehicles may be impounded if plows have to maneuver
- All snow and ice must be cleared from sidewalk within 24 hours
- It is illegal to shovel/blow snow onto public street
- Thank you.

- No parking during a snow event (ice, snow, hail, sleet or freezing rain).
- No parking until plowing is complete from pavement edge to pavement edge.
- Vehicles may be impounded or subject to penalty if snow plows have to maneuver around a vehicle.
- Property owners must remove all snow, ice and hail from sidewalk within twenty-four (24) hours of the end of the storm.
- It is unlawful to blow, shovel or plow snow from private property onto a public street.
- Any sidewalk where snow has not been removed may be abated by civil action.

The NSL City Council holds their meetings the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays at City Hall, (No CC meeting 11/2/21 due to municipal election.)

Meetings begin at 6:00 pm with a work session followed by the regular session at 7:00 pm in the Council Chambers. The NSL Planning Commission meets the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays at 6:30 pm, also at City Hall.
