

CODE ENFORCEMENT

With Winter weather on its way, the City's Code Enforcement Officer would like to remind property owners of their responsibility to keep trees trimmed for the public's safety as well as protecting City vehicles and equipment.

City Code 7-9-6 TREE MAINTENANCE:

Tree branches that overhang sidewalks or streets shall be pruned over the sidewalk and street so as not to interfere with public travel. Trees shall be pruned to provide 8 feet of clearance above the sidewalk and 14 feet of clearance above the roadway.



TRAIN HORNS UPDATE



Since 2008, NSL has been within a railroad quiet zone that extended from Ogden to SLC. This zone was allowed because the crossings in this area complied with the FRA safety requirements in place at the time, and trains could pass through without using their horns.

Federal safety requirements have since been amended making several of the 80 at-grade crossings in this quiet zone non-compliant. On Sept. 30, this quiet zone was suspended by the Federal Railroad Administration. NSL has a rail crossing at approx. 750 N. Main St. that is currently non-compliant due to three signal arms that must be upgraded and relocated. The repairs cannot be completed by the City or any of the City's contractors; rather, it can only be performed by Union Pacific who must approve the design, permit the construction and then do the work. Gateway Parks creates affordable opportunities for kids of all ages to enjoy tubing and the ski & snowboard hill everyday.

We are excited to announce that earlier this year, the City entered into an agreement with Gateway Parks for a tubing/winter operation at Eaglewood Golf Course.

The intent of Gateway Parks is to feature snow sport experiences and activities that were once only available in distant resort communities. Gateway Parks Eaglewood will include a snow tubing operation as well as a ski and snowboard experience at a reasonable price. Families looking to try skiing or snowboarding for the first time will have a great place to do that close to home.

The mix of traditional snow sports and snow tubing will be exciting for every member of the family and a great addition to Eaglewood.

Will there be enough snow? Yes! Gateway Parks is known as a non-stop tubing hill that always has snow thanks to top-of-the-line snow making machines. Equipment has already been delivered to Eaglewood, and crews are beginning to build the area designated for these operations.

Spectators can watch the action from a large gazebo with picnic tables as well as a fire pit at the base of the hill. Concessions will also be available.

The Gateway Parks section of the golf course is a separate operation. Select areas of the golf course will still be available for public access during the snow/winter season.

Thank you to everyone who has participated in the update to the City's General Plan! Since May of this year, the City has held several neighborhood meetings to gather input and discuss issues as part of the early stages in the City's General Plan update process. The consultant held a visioning meeting in June which assisted in formulating three identity scenarios for consideration. These three "identities" were further workshopped at a hands-on Pizza and Planning event in September. Additional comments on these concepts were presented on-line for the public to view and offer input through mid-October.

The Consultant will now utilize the comments received at these public meetings to develop and refine the overall City Vision and draft the General Plan update. The Plan will provide guidance and recommendations regarding future programs, land uses, and development within NSL for many years to come. Stay tuned as the draft plan will be available in coming months, with additional opportunities to provide feedback on the recommendations.





GOLF CARTS

Can I Drive my Golf Cart on the Road?



We love Eaglewood Golf Course. Not only is it a beautiful course offering an exceptional golf experience, but it is the central focus of the neighborhood surrounding the course.

Despite this area of the neighborhood being a golf course community, we differ from other areas, especially those with specifically developed infrastructure designed as golf resort communities.

With this in mind, we would like to remind, or clarify, that the operation of golf carts on our public streets is not allowed. Utah State Traffic Code 41-6a-1510 clearly prohibits the operation of a golf cart on public roads unless the municipality authorizes this operation. North Salt Lake has not authorized this. Our streets not only surround a golf course, but in many cases are significant traffic collector streets that make the operation of a golf cart hazardous to the operators and passengers. This is especially true of younger operators who don't understand traffic behavior and risks.

The police have been advised of an increasing number of complaints about illegally operated golf carts on our streets and will be taking appropriate enforcement action to curb this activity. Please be part of the solution by not driving golf carts on streets, nor allowing kids, licensed or not, to drive them on City streets.
