





RAILROAD QUIET ZONE INFORMATION



In last month's State of the City, Mayor Horrocks explained the Federal Railroad Administration's removal of the Woods Cross Quiet Zone. As an update, Salt Lake City and North Salt Lake submitted a joint waiver to the FRA hoping this combined approach would increase the chances of lifting the suspension as quickly as possible. An additional **comment period ending March 17, 2025**, has been added to the joint SLC NSL waiver Docket ID FRA-2024- 0124.

There are two ways to submit public comments related to the railroad quiet zone waiver. The best method is to submit comments directly to the Federal Railroad Administration using the button below. Additionally, there is a [public hearing](#) scheduled at City Hall March 4th at 7:00 pm.

NSL COMMUNITY GARDEN



Change is underway in the Foxboro wetlands area of the City. Contractors have begun making necessary storm drain and infrastructure changes to what will soon become the Foxboro Wetlands Park. Crews will be removing invasive species of trees and brush to make way for beautiful native landscaping along with raised board walks, viewing areas, and more.

NSL/WX DOG PARK




The cities of North Salt Lake and Woods Cross have partnered on the construction of a new off-leash dog park located above the northwest corner of Legacy Park. The fully-fenced park is expected to include areas for small and large dogs as well as play structures, shade areas, benches and a (human) restroom.

With the nearest dog parks being several miles away, this project addresses a need for more pet-friendly spaces where families can get outside and enjoy some quality time with their pets.

Watch for construction work to resume as weather permits in early 2025.

How to create defensible space

- **Clear debris**
- **Prune trees**
- **Use fire-resistant materials:**
- **Minimize combustible items**
- **Clear around propane tanks**
- **Maintain your property**


