FIRE PREVENTION




This year, like most along the Wasatch Front, fire danger is very high. The City reminds all residents that fireworks of any kind are prohibited above Orchard Drive. Please use caution anywhere in the City when you are using fireworks, particularly in areas where you may be near brush or dry grass.

In North Salt Lake, particularly in foothill locations, it is critically important to review the immediate conditions surrounding and adjacent to your property. NOTES ON WATER CONSERVATION



The State of Utah is preparing in many ways to meet the water needs of current and future residents. You can visit <https://prepare60.jvwcd.gov/> to learn more about growth in the State and what the needs are as we expect to double in population by the year 2060. The most cost-effective way to meet future needs is to adjust water habits and implement conservation methods.

For all of us, our most heavy water use occurs outside rather than indoors. Outdoor water supplies can fluctuate greatly depending upon the winter precipitation and annual snowpack. Today, the reservoirs that contain outdoor water supplies are doing well, but every week that passes without precipitation means that this year and next year's water supplies are negatively impacted. It is important to note that the entire State of Utah is in a drought condition and we must continue to conserve water in order to make supplies last as long as possible each season.

2025 MUNICIPAL ELECTION UPDATE



In this year's municipal election, North Salt Lake voters will elect a Mayor and fill two City Council seats.

Because five candidates filed to run for the City Council, a **primary election will be held on August 12, 2025**, to narrow the field. This primary applies only to the City Council race. The top four candidates will move on to the **general election on November 4, 2025**, where voters will make their final selections.

Registered voters will begin receiving their ballots in the mail this week for the primary election. You can return your completed ballot in any of the following ways:


- ✓By mail-- ballot must be received by the election officer on or before 8 pm on Election Day
- ✓Dropped in the official drop box at NSL City Hall (west parking lot).
- ✓In person at any Davis County polling location on Election Day, August 12 — including one at NSL City Hall.

UTILITY HARDSHIP ASSISTANCE PROGRAM



The City is pleased to announce the launch of a Utility Hardship Assistance Program designed to support residents facing financial difficulties. This program provides temporary relief by reducing monthly utility charges for qualifying households.

Program Benefits

Eligible participants will receive a 50% reduction in their city utility charges for a period of three months. Assistance may be extended for an additional three months, but may not exceed six months in any 36-month period.

Who Qualifies?

To be eligible for the program, applicants must be the named account holder with an account in good standing and meet the following criteria:

1. Annual household income at or below 150% of the federal poverty level,
2. Experiencing a qualifying hardship, such as:
 - Job loss or reduction in income
 - Medical emergency or ongoing health condition
 - Natural Disaster
 - Documented disability
 - Death, divorce, or separation of immediate household member
 - impacting household income

2025 STREET PRESERVATION TREATMENTS



Contractors are currently applying **chip seals and street overlays** to designated roads as part of this year's asphalt preservation effort. These treatments help slow pavement aging and extend the life of our streets.

Residents on affected streets were notified in advance via **postcards and door hangers**.

Reminders:

- **No street parking** is allowed on the day chip seal is applied and during follow-up sweeping.

Overlay work is scheduled for July 30–August 4 on various

- streets.

All vehicles must be off the street for 24 hours after the overlay is

- applied.

GET TO THE RIVER EVENT - SEPTEMBER 13


