## NORTH SALT LAKE BECOMES A JUST SERVE CITY



The City of North Salt Lake recently became an official JustServe City!

What does that mean? Becoming a *JustServe City* signifies that NSL has formally partnered with the JustServe initiative to promote and recognize community volunteerism. This partnership includes adopting a City Volunteerism Proclamation, supporting diverse groups in service, and recognizing individuals for their contributions through the JustServe platform.

The designation allows the City to officially encourage unity and service—making it easier for residents to find and participate in volunteer opportunities through the free JustServe website and app.

During the October 7, 2025, City Council meeting, JustServe representatives presented a certificate to City officials honoring NSL as an official JustServe City.

## ANNUAL FALL REMINDERS - PLEASE TRIM TREES



Fall is here and now is the time to trim your trees before snowplow season. This ensures the plows can safely reach the curb and clear the entire street without obstruction or damage from tree branches.

Trees shall be pruned to provide 8 feet of clearance over the sidewalk and 14 feet of clearance on the roadways; straight up from the curb. City Code 7-9-6 – Tree maintenance and pruning.

Park demolition is beginning the week of 10.20.25.

You may soon start seeing some activity at Hatch Park! As part of the park's long-awaited redevelopment, crews are scheduled to begin the first phase of demolition and mass grading. This initial phase should take about 3–4 months to complete.

The second phase—construction of the park's new features and improvements—is expected to begin in spring 2026 and continue for 12–18 months.

While several of the older trees will be removed during this process, we're pleased to share that the wood from these trees will be repurposed by a local artist who plans to create sculptural pieces and benches that will honor the park's history and natural beauty.

We truly appreciate the community's patience as we move forward with this important project.
