Construction Update

- I-15 Interchange @ 2600 South: UDOT has hired a design build team to reconstruct the I-15 overpass at 2600 South this spring. The first phase will include removing the existing bridge and replacing it. This will not impact traffic along 1100 North /2600 South during daytime hours; however, there will be occasional closures for east-west traffic along 2600 South during nighttime hours. There will be detour signs posted for the route to 1500 South in Woods Cross.
- I-15 HOV Lanes: This spring UDOT will be widening I-15 from the I-215 interchange in NSL to Farmington in both north and south directions. The lane widths along I-15 in these areas will be narrowed during the project, and there could be some lane closures during nighttime hours. Alternate routes will be US-89 and Legacy Parkway.

• 1100 N. Reconstruction:

1100 North from Redwood Rd. to the UPRR/UTA tracks at 80 East will be reconstructed this summer. Design is almost complete, with the five-month project expected to begin in May. During this time, the street will be closed to local traffic only. Therefore, we encourage all non-resident motorists to avoid that area. Detours for east-west traffic will be Center Street or 1500 South in Woods Cross.

• Springhill Landslide Area:

The final stabilization phase is more than halfway complete. Work includes installation of an open channel to collect spring water to limit further erosion of the hillside, along with placement of boulders and native plant seeds for long-term stabilization.

Street Asphalt Preservation:

Beginning in April or May of 2014, many city streets will receive slurry seals. Residents will be notified in advance of street closures (usually lasting two days). For scheduled streets, please refer to the February *Star* newsletter, also found on the website.



• Deer Hollow Reservoir:

Beautification of the project site is in progress. The fence is installed, and additional landscaping and improvements are planned for 2014.

• Street Reconstructions: Several streets are past the point of surface treatment and now require more extensive reconstructions. Roads scheduled for reconstruction beginning in April or May of 2014 are: Center St. (between Hwy. 89 and Orchard Dr.), Elk Hollow Rd. (from Cove Cir. to NSL City boundary), Cove Cir., Lofty Ln. (Eagleridge Dr. to 555 S. Lofty Ln.), and Hidden Ln. and Hidden Cir.


