

## How You Can Assist

Here are a few ways residents can assist the snow plowing process:

- Do not shovel or plow snow into City streets.
- Do not shovel or plow snow around fire hydrants or mailboxes.
- Keep distance from the snow plows.
- Keep children away from snow plows.
- Remove parked cars from the street.
- Do not attempt to pass a snow plow.
- Do not make snow tunnels on or near the street and driveways. Snow plows and other drivers may not see these and could accidentally injure someone playing inside of them.
- Be patient, understand that each storm is different and response time will vary.

## Winter Weather Operations

Providing safe travel on emergency, major arterial, and school routes will be the primary goal. Residential streets will be addressed in a timely manner after higher priority routes have been completed. The amount of snow and conditions during each event will determine the time required to remove snow and the degree to which streets are plowed. Understand that response time will depend on many different factors, including when the storm begins, snow moisture and storm duration.

Our snow removal crews are prepared to work 24 hours a day. As long as the snow keeps falling, the City's top priority is to keep main roads open and passable. For a detailed map showing snow plow priorities please visit [www.nslcity.org](http://www.nslcity.org).




## Sidewalks/Driveways

Shoveling sidewalks is a property or business owner's responsibility. It is unlawful to blow, shovel or plow snow from private property onto a public street or right of way. Shoveling snow to the side of your driveway will lessen the amount of snow left at your driveway entrance and/or sidewalks during plowing (See Snow Removal Guidelines).

Our crews make every effort to minimize the amount of snow plowed into driveways but because it is unrealistic for operators to lift or rotate plow blades as they pass each driveway it is inevitable that this will occur. We suggest clearing your driveway several times during a storm or waiting until City plowing activities have ended.

Understand that the final step of a snow removal operation is to push back the edges to widen the road to allow room for future snow, this may result in snow in your driveway.

## Winter Parking

Motorists may NOT park on public streets under the following weather conditions:

1. During a snowstorm where snow or ice are accumulating on the street; and,
2. After a snow event until the pavement has been plowed and cleared from edge to edge of the street in order to facilitate snow removal and emergency access.

*(This may be a day or two after the snowstorm, depending on the magnitude of the storm.) City Code 6-2-7(F)*
